Onsite activity

Work is progressing well at the project site, with strong momentum across our early works. Crews have established site offices, carried out vegetation management, and commenced earthworks.

We're delivering all activities in line with approved plans, with safety front of mind and a clear focus on minimising impacts to surrounding areas.

Over the coming weeks, we'll continue to ramp up activity as equipment and materials arrive, and more workers come onsite to support earthworks for the main battery energy storage system.

Our commitments

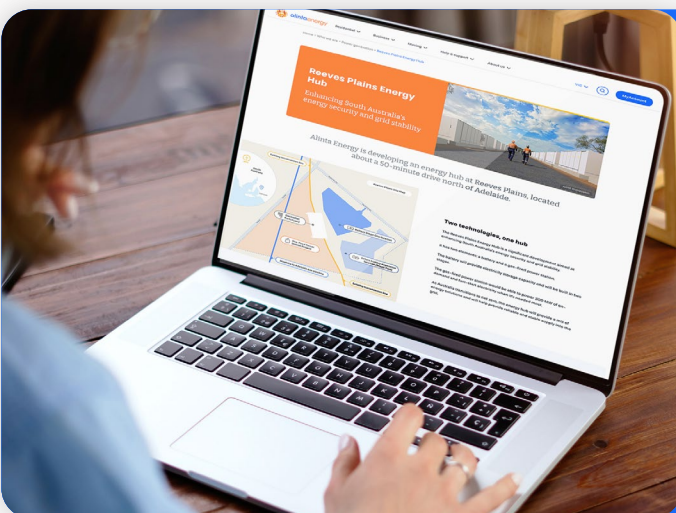
We want to be a good neighbour and for the Reeves Plains Battery project to have a positive impact on the region. That's why we've made a series of commitments – we call these our social licence commitments. These commitments guide us to support and strengthen the region during construction and into the future. This includes:

- establishing a **\$1.1 million** Community Benefit Sharing Fund, to support community led projects and initiatives
- investment in local content: **\$88 million** during development and construction (including \$2.2 million for local steel) as well as \$18 million during operations
- growing First Nations participation in contracts, jobs and training, backed by a **\$1.1 million** First Nations Benefit Fund
- delivering against our Supplier Engagement Plan and invest close to **\$3.9 million** in contracts with First Nations businesses
- prioritising suppliers with strong environmental credentials and
- reporting our social value each year to track the total invested through the local region such as jobs, procurement, training, and community investment.



We've published our social licence commitments, and we'll keep sharing updates as the project progresses.
