1. BESS STAGE 1 OVERVIEW

The first stage of the Reeves Plains Battery Project has started construction and will deliver a 250MW battery to help store renewable energy and keep the grid reliable.

Our commitment to local content

Construction of the hub will create jobs and opportunities for businesses to get involved. We are committed to maximising local content on the project by using local service providers and allocating roles for apprentices and learner workers during construction and operations.

We've committed to **\$88,327,000** to local content in development and construction and a further **\$2,180,000** during operations and Maintenance.

We've established an industry benefits fund investing **\$150,000** during construction and a further **\$60,000** for local business capability including meet the buyer sessions and tender ready support.
